

Holy Week Activities

From early times Christians have observed the week before Easter as a time of special devotion. From this beginning evolved the rites we observe today on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Here at St. Stephen's, we will also observe special services on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. Holy Week ends at sundown on the Saturday before Easter, with the celebration of the Easter Vigil on Sunday morning.

Easter Day - Sunday, March 31, 2024




- ► After the 6:00 AM Easter Vigil: breakfast will be served in the Parish Hall until 9:00 AM.
