Having passed the winter solstice, the days gradually grow longer in the months of January and February. The Epiphany season builds on the impression of "light coming into the world" as the Sunday gospel proclaims the calling of the apostles, the early teaching and healing ministry of Jesus, or the Sermon on the Mount. The manifestation of Jesus presses forward; the kingdom of God is breaking in. That light now must penetrate and illumine our minds, hearts, and actions. A seasonal blessing sums up the grace of Epiphany:

"May Christ, the Son of God, be manifest in you, that your lives may be a light to the world" (The Book of Occasional Services, 24).

The Epiphany season ends with the climactic epiphany of the Transfiguration. The Baptism of our Lord and his Transfiguration thus from the Epiphany season.

Lord God of our Fathers: God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

People Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.

Accept these prayers and praises, Father, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, your Church gives honor, glory, and worship, from generation to generation. **AMEN.**
