





THE NICENE CREED BCP 358

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As you know St Stephen's started the year with a budget that included a \$121,000 "Challenge" but through the efforts of many we are in the process of meeting this 'Challenge". Many Parishioners have responded with increased pledging and dedicated giving for specific projects and ministries. Additionally, we have been able to identify areas to become more efficient and cut our expenses, while at the same time increase our expected income through investments.

However, as often happens during the summer months, our income has decreased to the point where year to date expenses are currently above our income. Although this has happened in the past, and is usually temporary, it creates a cash flow challenge which makes it hard for us to meet our day to day operational expenses as well as unexpected expenses such as the recent HVAC system repairs.

We ask that everyone prayerfully consider their financial commitment to help ensure that St Stephen's has the resources we need to continue to support our work for the Lord.

COMMUNICATIONS

St. Stephen's has a number of volunteers that help keep St. Stephen's and our wider community up to date with church activities and events. More recently the committee has made a focused attempt to be more active with our social media precence. There are also smaller lesser-known jobs that often go unnoticed behind the scenes. For example, volunteers come in each week to mail materials to parishioners who do not have email access. The communications comittee has taken on a variety of tasks over recent years, especially in areas of technology and the livestreaming of services in light of the Covid pandemic. There is a recognized need to consolidate and streamline a lot of these activities, especially relating to creating the same content in numerous formats. Currently, our particular focus is enhancing our internal communication within the parish.

LIGHT BULB CHALLENGE!

Speaking of light bulbs, our Building team is working on repairing or replacing all of the drop ceiling lights in our building. The vast majority of them are not functioning properly and, even when they do, are consuming a lot of electricity. To do all the work that is required, it will cost us around \$4500.00

To help offset the cost to the repair and maintenance budget, we are asking individuals and families in St. Stephen's to consider contributing for one light. Each fixture (bulb and ballast) will cost \$60. We have 72 fixtures in the building. These upgraded bulbs and fixtures will both produce brighter light and help reduce electrical output.
