Ash Wednesday Services Including A New Family-Friendly 4:30 PM Service

There will be FOUR services on Ash Wednesday, March 5th. Please join us either at 6:30 AM, 12:10 PM or 7 PM as we enter the season of Lent. In addition to our 3 regular Ash Wednesday services, we will offer a more *kid-friendly* service at 4:30 PM as well. This service will be shorter and geared specifically to talking about Ash Wednesday and Lent in general with our kids. If the weather is good, we will meet outside in the Memorial Garden (Chapel if it rains).

Lectionary Class

The Lectionary Class at St. Stephen's is unique in that it is a discussion each Sunday about the Gospel that is in that Sunday's bulletin insert. It is also unique in that the class is led each Sunday by a member of the class. Recent leaders have been Roger Johnson, Steve Damos, Emily Doane, Gary Dreier, Mary Ellen Klots, Joseph Womble and Father Bailey. If you'd like a better understanding of the Bible (who doesn't), come to a Lectionary class on Sundays at 9:30 am in the Pollard library.

Instructed Eucharist Class

Fr. Bailey will also be offering an extended Instructed Eucharist class at 9:30 in the chapel. What is an Instructed Eucharist? In years past, St. Stephen's has offered an "extended" Eucharist during regular service in which the priest pauses to teach and explain certain parts of the service and why we do things the way we do. In this class, we will take a piece of the Eucharist service each week, carry it out together, and then talk about the origins and meaning behind each part. Toward the end of the class (closer to Lent), we will host a Eucharist one evening with a dinner following that will emphasize what we have learned. Loose Plate Offering

For February, the Open Offering goes to The Family Resource Center of Oak Ridge.

The Family Resource Center of Oak Ridge (FRC) was founded in 1993 by the Tennessee Department of Education, as one of 13 Centers in the state. It has an office at Willowbrook and one at Glenwood Elementary Schools. Its mission is to break down barriers to a child's educational success and to eliminate problems that keep families from becoming fully functioning and independent members of their community. Below is some information about this important ministry to the at-risk children and their families.

- · FRC provides emergency assistance with utilities, rent, gas to get to work, medication, rides, clothes, shoes, and short hotel stays (for families that have lost their residence).
- · FRC provides important case management services (home visits, collaborating with community mental/behavioral health providers and acting as a family advocate).
- · FRC provides children's programs: Food for Kids, school supplies assistance and children's clothing closet.
- · FRC provides adult programs: Parenting programs, job skills/resume assistance and budget classes.
- · Last year FRC served 392 unduplicated families and 902 children, and networked with over 200 professionals, medical, and social services providers.
- · There is one full time staff member, Jo Bruce, ED, who has been the director since FRC inception. There is also one part-time assistant.
- · All donations will be used for direct assistance for the clients. Staff salaries and benefits are paid by the Tennessee Department of Education.
