The Loose Offering for the month of August is TORCH

TORCH (Tennessee Out-Reach Center for the Homeless) is a non-profit whose mission is to rapidly house the homeless and help stabilize the family once placed. Since its opening in 2013, TORCH has continued to grow as it strives to meet the growing homelessness in Anderson County.

In 2022, TORCH served 386 adults and 236 children, comprising 164 families and 125 individuals. Services include: advocacy, basic needs, bus tickets, case management, emergency shelter, food, gas cards, housing, hotel/motel, material goods, street outreach, referrals, rent deposits, rent assistance, safe housing, utility deposits and utility assistance.

In March 2022, TORCH achieved a long-term goal of building three duplexes, named Bookhart Village, at 128 Hamilton Circle. Our own Judie Liby spearheaded and supervised this entire process. Bookhart Village provides rent-free transitional housing for families in four 2-bedroom units and two efficiencies. Oak Ridge Housing Authority manages the properties and provides necessary support as the families work towards self-sufficiency and obtaining permanent housing.
