Candlemas Day

Next Sunday, February 2nd, is Candlemas Day--a tradition that goes back 1500 years! It is often considered the last "Feast Day" of the Christmas cycle of light: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, then Candlemas. Candlemas is actually a Mass where the candles used in the Church and in our households are blessed. If you would like to have your household candles blessed, please bring them to the service of your choice.

Following the 10:30 Service, the children and youth should join us in the Parish Hall for some "flipping good fun" as we celebrate the French tradition of La Chandeleur! To celebrate, the French prepare crepes. Medieval farmers believed that it was critically important to make crepes on that day to insure a healthy wheat harvest. This tradition continues today with people flipping crepes while holding a coin. If they catch their crepe, they will have good fortune. If the crepe sticks to the ceiling or falls to the floor, their fortune is in question! Crepes for flipping--and for eating--will be provided along with apple cider.

New Adult Ed - Instructed Eucharist Class

We will continue our wonderful Lectionary Study each Sunday! As an alternative, Fr. Bailey will be offering an extended Instructed Eucharist class beginning this Sunday at 9:30 in the chapel. What is an Instructed Eucharist? In years past, St. Stephen's has offered an "extended" Eucharist during regular service in which the priest pauses to teach and explain certain parts of the service and why we do things the way we do. In this class, we will take a piece of the Eucharist service each week, carry it out together, and then talk about the origins and meaning behind each part. Toward the end of the class (closer to Lent), we will host a Eucharist one evening with a dinner following that will emphasize what we have learned.

Some of you may be unfamiliar with Brysonn's Closet, located in the old Anderson's Hilltop Market at the corner of West Outer Drive and Illinois Avenue. In the back of the Brysonn's Closet Thrift Store is a small food bank that serves over 100 individuals a month from Anderson, Roane and Morgan Counties.

The folks who come to Brysonn's are some of the poorest of the poor. After meeting with a caring worker, essential food items as well as pet food (if needed) and hygiene/cleaning items are given to the family. Brysonn's Closet is a non-profit totally supported by donations. All donations will be used by several Outreach members to purchase food, hygiene items, pet food, and cleaning supplies.
